



In Sunday's Gospel, the blind Bartimaeus had to make up his mind about Jesus without the benefit of seeing him. He asked Jesus for the gift of sight. His faith was rewarded with vision. We all learn about Jesus through what we hear of him from those who teach us and from what we see in his followers. Our faith response is also rewarded with the gift of vision. We come to see Jesus as our Lord and Teacher who leads us to the Father.

Exploring the Gospel Message

Seeds (Preschool): When you help your child become more aware of the larger world, you are helping him or her become aware of the signs of God's love and goodness. That is the way you can help build a foundation of faith. Ask your child to tell you the story of the blind man. Ask: What gift did Jesus give the man? Play a seeing game like "I Spy" with your child. Point out that signs of God's love are all around us.

Promise (Grades K–1): The booklet your child brings home this week will help him or her tell the story of the blind man who came to Jesus. Talk about the gift of seeing. Take a family walk with your child and discover all the wonderful things to see. Look for animals, flowers, trees, and people. At the end of the walk, say a prayer of thanks for all the gifts God gives.

Good News (Grades 2–3): Children of this age are often very willing to follow another's lead. Talk about how important it is to know when to follow and when not to follow someone. The class also explored the Fifth Commandment and learned about anger and how this Commandment forbids the use of violence against others. It also is a Commandment about respecting others and all of Creation. Talk about ways your family handles anger and how you show respect for others and the world.

Venture (Grades 4–6): Your child's class came to recognize that Jesus calls them to faith in him as God's Son. From the story of the blind man, they learned that there is more to "seeing" than just with one's eyes. The class also learned that the sacraments are signs that help us experience God's grace. As a family, talk about the sacraments. Share your experiences of family Baptisms and Confirmations, the Eucharist, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Visions (Grades 7–9): Ask your youngster to share what he or she learned about the Second Vatican Council during this week's class. Share why this great event in the history of the Church is so important for today's world. Talk about the lesson of the man who was born blind. As a family, discuss where you see examples of love and faith in your neighborhood, at work, at school, or in the world.

Pray Together

October is the month of the Holy Rosary. As a family, pray at least one decade of the Rosary together. Make the recitation of the Rosary an interesting and happy event. Ask the Blessed Mother to pray to take away any family "blindness" and give you all the vision of those who follow Jesus.

Gospel Table Talk

- Read this Sunday's Gospel (<u>usccb.org/bible/readings/</u>).
- Have everyone close their eyes. What would it be like to live without eyesight?
- Those who cannot see must use other senses such as hearing and touch to help them "see" in other ways.
- How can we use our eyes to "tell" if someone needs our help? What should we look for? Emphasize how we must OPEN our eyes and LOOK for those who need help, or we may not notice them which makes us "blind," too.

HOW TO MAKE A REPORT OF SEXUAL ABUSE

Child sexual abuse is a crime in the State of New Hampshire and the Church. New Hampshire law requires that anyone who has reason to suspect that a child is being or has been abused or neglected must make a report to the Division for Children, Youth & Families ("DCYF") of the State of New Hampshire, 1-800-894-5533. Any person who suspects or alleges child abuse on the part of a priest, deacon, employee, or volunteer of a parish, school, or institution of the diocese of Manchester is also encouraged to make a report to the Office for Ministerial Conduct, 603-669-3100. Church personnel - clergy, paid employees, and volunteers - have additional reporting requirements if they believe that Church personnel have sexually abused a child. Boldly Believe!

I trarely does any good to follow the crowd. Most people follow the path of least resistance, just floating along. Jesus said the path to heaven is narrow and few follow it. Dare to believe in eternal truths, in Jesus, and swim against the current.

Just look at what happened to blind Bartimaeus. He wanted the impossible, to be healed by Jesus, but he was at a big disadvantage. He couldn't see Jesus in order to find him. So, what did he do? He started by using his only strength—his loud voice. He couldn't run after Jesus but could only sit and call out.

Sunday Readings

I will lead them to streams of water, / on a level road, without stumbling.

Hebrews 5:1-6

Every high priest is taken from among men...He is able to deal patiently with the ignorant and erring, for he himself is beset by weakness.

Mark 10:46-52

[Bartimaeus] threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus....
"Master, I want to see."

Lesson one: Use whatever talent you have to reach Jesus. Don't focus on what you lack but on what you have.

The crowd told him to be quiet and polite, not upsetting the moment. Bartimaeus "kept calling out all the more" (Mark 10:48). Lesson two: Ignore the crowd if they keep you from Jesus and your dreams.

Jesus hears his cry and calls for Bartimaeus, who springs up with a newfound joy because Jesus reached out to him. He stumbles toward him, directed by the crowd. Lesson three: Go to Jesus with your weakness! It doesn't bother him. It attracts him.

Jesus asks what he wants, and blind Bartimaeus boldly asks for the impossible: to see. Impossible, unless he believed Jesus was in fact the Son of David, the Messiah, the miracle worker. Jesus gives him exactly what his faith merited. Lesson four: Boldly believe and pursue the impossible. Jesus wants to give it to you! +

Dare to believe in eternal truths, in Jesus, and swim against the current.

In the biblical tradition, the Son of Man is the one who receives from God "dominion, glory, and kingship" (Daniel 7:14).

A Tough Language

I've been a student of the Spanish language for many years, and I've bitten my tongue (literally) more times than I can count trying to say tonguetwisting words and phrases. It's tough to learn a new language. Think back to when you studied a language that was new to you in high school or college. Or maybe you took a crash course in Italian in anticipation of a once-in-a-lifetime trip to Rome. Or it could be that in the world of international business and your travel for work, you had to learn words in Chinese or Korean.

Nouns verbs, pronouns, conjugations, and declensions are all mind-expanding, headache-inducing, and not at all easy to remember. Plus, it's tough trying to get your mouth coordinated for the pronunciation of consonants and vowels you never heard of and tuning your ears to sounds that are unfamiliar and indecipherable. While learning a new language can be challenging, the process can be made a bit easier—or should I say, more palatable—with help.

Like learning a new language, learning to pray can be tough! It can be very much like taking Spanish 101. I'm not talking about learning Aramaic, the language Jesus likely spoke, or even speaking in tongues. I'm talking about learning to converse freely and familiarly with our Savior, Jesus Christ, who came from heaven, returned there, and who desperately wants us to end up there one day.



The good news is many of the tools that are helpful in learning languages are transferable. They can also be helpful in building a prayer life. For example, repeating words over and over and committing them to memory creates a structure to build on when learning other new words. Repetition teaches the muscles in your mouth and face new patterns of movement and your ears new sounds.

A mentor can encourage, correct, model conversation and proper pronunciation, and teach dialogue. And help you laugh at yourself. Have a sense of humor, be willing to embarrass yourself, and don't take yourself too seriously.

Time—maybe months and years—is required. Some courses promise proficiency in weeks. Impossible! Only time, and lots of it, can get mind and mouth in sync so that you can one day achieve fluency. So much can get lost in translation.

"In the beginning was the Word," says the Scriptures (John 1:1). At Christmas we will celebrate the day when God in Christ Jesus came to earth. He then learned to speak human words so we might learn to speak heavenly words and someday fully comprehend the Word that was spoken at the beginning of time. To learn the language of heaven, take the Gospels seriously. Repeating Jesus' words expands our minds and hearts. Find a mentor, someone well-versed in prayer, and take time—lots of it—to practice. Who wants to get to heaven and find out they don't speak the language? It's time to learn a second language! +

A prayer mentor might be just the ticket for you.
