END OF LIFE PLANNING

Three Beliefs is a document from the Diocese of Manchester that gives valuable assistance to Catholics and others on end-of-life issues. *Three Beliefs* explains Catholic teaching on life-sustaining treatment and care and includes the New Hampshire Advance Directive form modified in such a way to make it consistent with both Catholic teaching and New Hampshire law. *Three Beliefs* contains a helpful FAQ section and wallet cards that include important information for healthcare providers.

The New Hampshire Advance Directive form was revised by a law that is consistent with Catholic teaching and the changes to the New Hampshire form. If you completed an advance directive before 2021 and your intentions for your end-of-life care have not changed, you do not need to complete a new form as long as your advance directive was valid when it was executed. For example, if you completed the October 2007 version of *Three Beliefs* and signed the document before two witnesses or a notary public or justice of the peace, you do not need to complete a new advance directive form.

Copies of *Three Beliefs* are available at the church entrance.

MARRIAGE IN THE CHURCH

Did you know that ALL Catholics are required to be married in the Church as a condition of the validity of their marriage?

Any Catholic married in a civil ceremony (JP) or in any religious ceremony other than a Catholic one (unless specifically excepted by the Bishop) is not living out the Sacrament of Marriage in its fullness according to the teaching of the Church. Fear Not!

E asier said than done! There is so much to be afraid of today: war, the loss of life and the resulting devastation, unemployment and poverty, illness and the pain and diminishment, the threat of ecological collapse, to say nothing of personal anxiety and trauma. The readings for this Sunday all speak of the hardships that loom over every life.

But these hardships are not the last word. Jeremiah ends his announcement of gloom on a positive note: "Praise the Lord, / For he has rescued the life of the poor / from the power of the evildoers!"

Sunday Readings

Jeremiah 20:10-13

The Lord is with me, like a mighty champion: my persecutors will stumble, they will not prevail.

Romans 5:12-15

If by that one person's transgression the many died, how much more did the grace of God...overflow.

Matthew 10:26-33

[Jesus said,] "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." (Jeremiah 20:13). The psalm of lament picks up the same message: "the Lord hears the poor" (Psalm 69:34). Saint Paul insists that sin and death don't win: "... How much more did the grace of God... overflow for the many" (Romans 5:15). Caught in the throes of misfortune, people cry out—but God responds.

It is in the Gospel that the reassurance of God's care unfolds. The struggles described there are real, but they will not last. The imagery employed to characterize God's care is picturesque and extraordinarily tender. If God is attentive to the lowly sparrows, how much more will God be attentive to us? Even more personally, God knows us so well that the very hairs on our head are counted. The admonition here is clear: Never fear! If catastrophes threaten, don't be afraid! Even if they engulf you or carry you away, don't be afraid. It is only temporary. God is always there, attentive to our needs, so fear not! #



Only Six Months Until Christmas!

Y esterday the Church celebrated another Nativity—the birth of Jesus' cousin John, as in John the Baptist, the Prophet, the Forerunner. But before all that, John is the miracle baby – a child born of elderly Zechariah and Elizabeth who, until now, have lived with the "disgrace" of barrenness.

The Scripture says that when the Angel Gabriel, that Announcer of Miracle Babies, told Zechariah he was to have a son, Zechariah, no doubt thinking of his wife of advancing years and his own white hair, said, in effect, "I don't think so." His doubt rendered him mute. If you think about it, this is what doubt does. Doubt stifles our joy with suspicion, curbs our celebration with caution, strangles our proclamation of the Good News with, "Hold on just a minute, let's be realistic, you can't really expect me to believe that!"

Zechariah had just heard the answer to his prayers. As a couple they had certainly prayed for children and their childlessness was one of the great sorrows of their long life together. But when heart's desire is finally realized, sometimes we don't believe it.

We pray and pray for the Messiah to come and he says, "Here I am!" and we don't believe him. We pray and pray for



peace or for love or for fulfillment or for the chance to make a difference in this world and God says, "OK, here's what you can do!" and we ignore him.

Sometimes heart's desire is disguised as losing a job or not getting the promotion, passing the test, winning the race. Sometimes what we really want is contained within a "No" from God and it is then that we must have the courage to say "Yes" to God's "No" because hidden in that "No" is the "Yes!" we've been waiting for.

When the unexpected happens, even the unwelcome unexpected, we should be listening hard for the messenger's voice. A miracle birth is about to take place – maybe inside you. **†**

After working with the Redemptorist novices of North America, I wish every Catholic young person had the opportunity to make a lay novitiate—six months of learning about the spiritual life and methods of prayer, and reading the great classic writings of the Catholic tradition. They would learn about themselves by looking at their family background and their relationships and, especially, by writing a spiritual autobiography about their relationship with Christ throughout their lives.

Fortunately, much of what can be accomplished in a novitiate can also be accomplished through a program of regular spiritual direction. For a young person looking to discover what God really wants of him or her, a year-long program of weekly meetings with a spiritual director is a step in the right direction. Just be sure to start with the right question: "Lord, what do you want me to do?" **#**
