END OF LIFE PLANNING

Three Beliefs is a document from the Diocese of Manchester that gives valuable assistance to Catholics and others on end-of-life issues. Three Beliefs explains Catholic teaching on life-sustaining treatment and care and includes the New Hampshire Advance Directive form modified in such a way to make it consistent with both Catholic teaching and New Hampshire law. Three Beliefs contains a helpful FAQ section and wallet cards that include important information for healthcare providers.

The New Hampshire Advance Directive form was revised by a law that is consistent with Catholic teaching and the changes to the New Hampshire form. If you completed an advance directive before 2021 and your intentions for your end-of-life care have not changed, you do not need to complete a new form as long as your advance directive was valid when it was executed. For example, if you completed the October 2007 version of *Three Beliefs* and signed the document before two witnesses or a notary public or justice of the peace, you do not need to complete a new advance directive form.

Copies of *Three Beliefs* are available at the church entrance.

MARRIAGE IN THE CHURCH

Did you know that ALL Catholics are required to be married in the Church as a condition of the validity of their marriage?

Any Catholic married in a civil ceremony (JP) or in any religious ceremony other than a Catholic one (unless specifically excepted by the Bishop) is not living out the Sacrament of Marriage in its fullness according to the teaching of the Church. RETROUVAILLE A Lifeline For Married Couples

Retrouvaille (pronounced Retro-vi) means rediscovery in French. This program helps couples put their broken pieces back together and rediscover their love for each other. This program starts with a weekend which teaches couples a new form of communication called Dialogue and lets couples know that they are not alone. 

Do You Know Who I Am?

That question usually means: "Do you know how important I am?" Reputation, status, and celebrity are extraordinarily significant in today's society. Vulnerable, unsure beings that we are, we need to be reassured that we are important. And we are important, though usually not in the way society might perceive it.

Each of us is unique. Yet our personal uniqueness does not diminish the uniqueness of others, and there's the rub! So often we think that it does. That's when we might try to put others down or demand, "Do you know who I am?"

Often we don't really know who we are. This is where humility enters the picture.

In today's first reading, the king rides on a donkey. He doesn't need a mighty warhorse to show others his importance or to reassure himself of his royal identity. Nor does he need military armaments like a chariot or bow to establish peace. He is secure with himself. He knows who he is—no more, but no less.

The Gospel portrays Jesus as "meek and humble of heart" (Matthew 11:29). He knows who he is. He is the Son of the Father, sent by the Father to do the will of the Father. All things are in his hands, because he received everything from the Father. He does not have to broadcast this or argue with others to convince them. He knows who he is. He is the Son—no more, but no less.

And what about you? Do you know who you are? †



When Jesus Was Deported

M aria and Jesus picked up their two children, ages seven and ten, from school. On the way home, they stopped at the supermarket. When they got home, Maria took the children into the house as Jesus unpacked the car. When she peeked out the front window of their Philadelphia row house a few minutes later, the car trunk was open and Jesus was gone. He'd been picked up by ICE (United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement). Ten days later, he was deported.

More than at any other time in history, Church leaders are calling on local and national government leaders of all nations to care for immigrants and refugees. History has certainly seen anti-immigrant organizations, movements, and politics flourish; the anti-immigrant, anti-Roman Catholic Know-Nothing Party of the 1800s illustrates the point. But never before has our great nation of immigrants' descendants experienced the organized



removal of millions of undocumented immigrants. Many states are sending a strong message to immigrants: You're not welcome. Go home!

In May 2012, during the *ad limina* visit of United States bishops to the Vatican, Pope Benedict praised the US bishops for their extraordinary care for immigrants. Indeed, with the guidance of the bishops' Justice for Immigrants campaign (JusticeForImmigrants.org),

some dioceses, religious orders, parishes, and individuals have begun to generously and gently accompany immigrants and immigrant communities, regardless of their citizenship status.

Some is a key qualifying word. Some lay faithful are at odds with the bishops over this polarizing issue, but we cannot refuse to see and understand that immigration and its reform are Catholic issues. Something very odd is at work here. How can American Catholics sing "Faith of our Fathers" in their Italian, German-, Irish-, Polish-, or Slovak-built churches and cathedrals on Sunday, and then deport Jesus on Monday? *#

Pope Francis and the American bishops have continued to call ordinary Catholics to open their hearts and hands to welcome immigrants and refugees.
