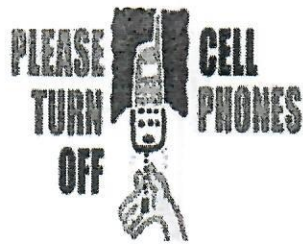
PARISH VISION STATEMENT

CHRISTMAS SEASON LITURGICAL SCHEDULE

December 30-31 is the Feast of the Holy Family. Our Christmas observance will follow the usual calendar with a Vigil Liturgy on Saturday December 30 at 4:00 PM in Plaistow and with Sunday Liturgies at 8:00 in Newton and 10:00 am in Plaistow.

January 1, the Octave Day of Christmas, and the Solemnity of Mary, Τέοποκος - Mother of God, is **not a holy day of obligation in the US this year**. We will gather for a Vigil Liturgy on **Sunday, December 31 at 4:00 PM in Plaistow** and on **January 1 at 9 am in Newton**. We will close the Octave celebration with Christmas Evening Prayer at 6:00 PM in Newton.

January 6-7 is the Solemnity of the Epiphany. Our Liturgical schedule will follow the usual calendar with Vigil Liturgy on Saturday January 6 at 4:00 PM in Plaistow and with Liturgies on Sunday January 7 at 8:00 am in Newton and 10:00 am in Plaistow We will gather for Epiphany Evening Prayer on Sunday, January 7 at 6:00 PM in Newton.



January 8 is the feast of the Baptism of the Lord and the conclusion of the Christmas season. We will follow the usual weekday schedule and gather for Liturgy on Monday, January 8 at 8:00 am in Newton. We will gather for the final vespers of the Christmas season on Monday, January 8 at 6:00 PM in Newton.

GUIDELINES FOR THE RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

FOR CATHOLICS: As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (Canon 916). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

FOR OUR FELLOW CHRISTIANS: We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions that separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21). Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion. Eucharistic sharing in exceptional circumstances by other Christians requires permission according to the directives of the diocesan bishop and the provisions of canon law (canon 844 § 4). Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. According to Roman Catholic discipline, the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of communion by Christians of these Churches (canon 844 § 3).

FOR THOSE NOT RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION: All who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.

FOR NON-CHRISTIANS: We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.



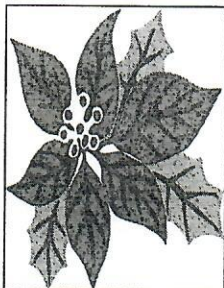
Special Collection

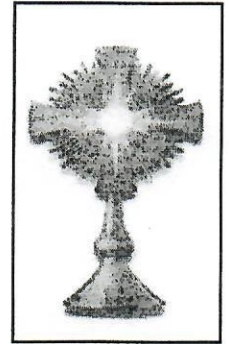

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION AT SAINT LUKE



For Catholics, the "real presence" of the Lord in the Eucharist is a touchstone for prayer and a challenge celebrated both in the reception of the Eucharist and in silent adoration before the Sacrament.

We hold weekly Eucharistic Adoration on Thursdays, from 8:30 am through 8:30 PM at the church in Newton.

Church Canon Law states someone must be in attendance in Church any time the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for veneration.

ADORERS NEEDED AT ADORATION

We are truly blessed to have times for Adoration of Our Lord in our Parish. This time of prayer and intercession is not only a source of great grace for the individual but is a great source of grace for us as a parish family. **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AT SAINT LUKE
THE EVANGELIST**

Discipleship is a lifelong journey.

Lifelong faith formation provides opportunities and experiences throughout the entire life span to strengthen our relationship with and knowledge of God. A commitment to lifelong faith formation serves to enhance our understanding of Scripture and of our Tradition. It sustains us in living as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Our Religious Education Program represents more than religious instruction for children. We believe in extending the classroom experience to the worship life of the community, to the life of the child at

school, at home or with friends, and into the larger community. Our community has a commitment to adult education and faith formation, designed to present the Church's rich history and teaching in an adult format. We also offer an extensive program in "scripture study" that involves reflecting on and learning more about God's Word, revealed in the Bible and shared with the Church through the readings of the Lectionary, the cycle of readings used at Liturgy. The Parish also offers programs derived from the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults and the Rite for Christian Initiation for Children. These programs welcome non-Baptized persons and persons wishing to join the Church.



Saint Luke the Evangelist Parish invites all to a deeper love of Jesus and to a fullness of communion with the Church. The **rites of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)** is a process where adults and older children are welcomed into the Catholic Church. Some have never been Baptized, others never received Eucharist or Confirmation, and others arrive at our door

after a long faith journey.

Do you know someone who is thinking about becoming part of our Catholic community? Are you the non-Catholic spouse of a parishioner who is wondering about full communion with the Church? Are you an adult Catholic who for whatever reason, "missed" one or more of the sacraments of initiation while growing up? Do you have children over 7 years of age who were never Baptized, or older children who "missed" sacraments?

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (and its adapted form for children) welcomes all kinds of people into the Catholic family. The RCIA is for any adult who is: unbaptized and recognizes a need for spirituality in their life or Baptized and raised in another Christian tradition but interested in learning about the Catholic faith, or Baptized in the Catholic faith, but never received any formal religious training.

Children of all ages are welcome and participate in age-appropriate meetings for their RCIA experience.

PARENTS BAPTISM PREPARATION



Baptisms are typically celebrated at Sunday Liturgy at Saint Luke's. Families wishing to celebrate Baptism in the Church must be **REGISTERED** (according to Church Canon law) and **PRACTICING** (attending Sunday Mass) for 3 full months before a Baptism can be scheduled. The use of the envelope system is always optional, however it does guarantee a manner of accountability. For most families, the Pastor or staff can easily verify attendance during these three months. Baptismal Sponsors (godparents) are also regulated by Church Canon Law. Sponsors must be at least 16, fully initiated (having received Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation), and be practicing Catholics living Christian lives consistent with the Church's teaching. Please contact the Parish Office with questions.

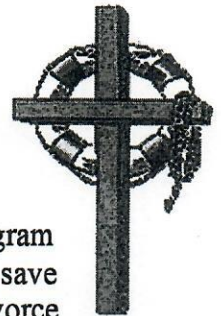
MARRIAGE IN THE CHURCH

Did you know that all Catholics are required to be married in the Church as a condition of the validity of their marriage?

Any Catholic married in a civil ceremony (JP) or in any religious ceremony other than a Catholic one (unless specifically excepted by the Bishop) is not living out the Sacrament of Marriage in its fullness according to the teaching of the Church.
