SAFETY AND SECURITY

Our Parish properties are active places, where traffic and parked vehicles are a constant presence in the ebb and flow of a busy week. It is important to remember that because of the activity on both campuses, it is easy for someone looking for a quick deed to find a vehicle. Please be sure to lock and secure your vehicle when you are parked on either campus. If possible, secure valuables out of sight or make sure valuables in an open bed truck are secure. We have requested extra police presence in our lots during Masses, but patrols can only do so much. Each of us are responsible for making sure, as best we as are able, that our vehicles are safe and secure. Anyone seeing something or someone unusual in the lots is welcome to contact the local police.



FROM THE PASTOR

Our church in Plaistow has long had a chair lift system installed on the southeast (office) side of the building. For forty years, it has helped those who have access issues enter and exit the church. But the system has its limitations: it cannot handle the weight of larger wheelchairs, making it useless for those who are permanently wheelchair bound. For the past few years, the chair lift has developed quirks that have made it undependable. Because of its age, it cannot be repaired or upgraded, and the Parish does not have any funds to replace the system. Over Easter Sunday, a person tried to use the system with the help of our Ushers, and the lift failed twice, trapping the person on the staircase. All was made well by our Ushers who stepped up to help, and the person who was stuck (twice!) was unharmed and went on their Easter way with a smile. But we are done. I cannot risk having another incident with the chair lift and having somebody stuck midair. The system has been shut down and is no longer available to anyone. We have not had large numbers of people requesting the chair lift, and we will try to accommodate people who need help as best we can.

ADORERS NEEDED AT ADORATION

We are truly blessed to have times for Adoration of Our Lord in our Parish. This time of prayer and intercession is not only a source of great grace for the individual but is a great source of grace for us as a parish family. We have many who have made the commitment to spend an hour each week with our Eucharistic Lord. Adoration takes place each Thursday in Newton from 8:30 AM to 8:30 PM. We also need people at all times so we can have 2 people at each hour. If you can commit to one hour a week in Adoration of our Lord, or if you can be a substitute, please contact Cathy Smith at 603-382-8324, ext. 305, or email her at csmith@stluketheevangelist.net.

The Church in Plaistow is open all day on Wednesdays for people to stop by and pray before the presence of Jesus in the tabernacle.



What's New?

veryone gets a bit excited with the prospect of something new, whether it's a new job, a new car, or a new phone. This new thing might simply be a replacement. However, when it is a new model, an upgrade, we get even more excited. Revelation uses a distinctive Greek word, *kainós*, for this second kind of newness. The new heaven, the new earth, the new Jerusalem (and the new commandment mentioned in the gospel) suggest radical newness—the kind resulting from an act of God. Centuries earlier, the prophet Isaiah had promised a new

John 13:31-33a, 34-35

[Jesus said,] "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." heaven and a new earth. (See Isaiah 65:17.) This metaphor pointed to a time of eschatological peace and fulfillment, a time when the covenant relationship between God and the people would be renewed and last forever. This was a promise the people held dear.

How are we to read this passage from Revelation today? Is it referring to a time in this life? Or after this life? It may actually refer to both. We believe that, with his death and resurrection, Jesus inaugurated this time of fulfillment. However, its full establishment is not yet complete, hence the new commandment to "love one another" (John 13:34). When we truly follow this commandment and love each other, we actually make present the new heaven and new earth; we make real the new Jerusalem, God's covenant partner. However, the ultimate fulfillment will come when God finally brings all things to completion. That is when everything will be new. #

he simple act of sowing and planting seeds in due season is a powerful and most rewarding one for both gardeners and farmers. The power comes from the fact that in cooperating

with the Creator, we build up our own food security and that of those who partake of our table. We basically garden to feed ourselves naturally, inexpensively, and in a healthy manner, and there is always the added joy when the fruit of our work is shared with others.

It is a command from the revealed word of God not to hurt the environment and to care for the land, the water, and all living things, God's own creation. And among these living things we include not only all human beings but also the kingdoms of animals and vegetation. Planting continues in earnest in our gardens during the early May days: we divide and transplant certain herbs and perennials, and ceaselessly we continue planting seeds in the vegetable garden: carrots, beets, turnips, radishes. There is a perennial mystery in the propagation of plants from tiny,

almost microscopic, seeds. Again the Lord provides human beings with this wonderful gift, this unique reality called a seed. And from the seeds, all our food in the vegetation kingdom is raised weekly, monthly, yearly. As a Chinese proverb tells us: "All the flowers (and all the vegetables) of all the tomorrows are in the seeds of today." #
