NEW HAMPSHIRE CATHOLIC APPEAL

Our Parish 2025 goal is \$47,579.00. The Parish keeps any income raised above our set fundraising goal. Goals are set by the Diocese at 10% of the average of the last three years of our assessable income (excluding the pandemic shut down year of 2020).

Approximately 95%, of the New Hampshire Catholic Appeal (NHCA) revenue will go towards ministry, education, and parishes. The goal is for less than 5% of revenue to be spent on administering the NHCA. The intent of the Diocese is to keep these costs as low as possible. No funds will go towards diocesan administration, the bishop's office, or any clergy abuse settlements/litigation.

Many Diocesan second collections have been eliminated. The second collections eliminated in 2023 are the Seminary Fund, the Catholic education collection, the Parish-to-Parish Support Fund, the NH Missionaries Abroad and Migrant & Refugee Ministry in NH, the Catholic University of America and USCCB, the NH Priest Retirement Fund and the annual drive for *Parable* Magazine. In addition, the annual appeal for Catholic Charities will no longer take place since the Catholic Appeal takes the place of the Catholic Charities Appeal of years past.

Many of these needs and ministries were previously funded through second collections. These second collections have been eliminated or consolidated into the NHCA. Parishioners can still give to any of these causes and programs separately, though it does not count towards the overall NHCA Parish goal.

Bringing Home the Word

I Believe in God

What do we mean when we say this? We are saying that we don't understand it, but we believe it; we accept it as truth. How do we know it's true? First, we must remember that we are standing before the greatest mystery of all—the mystery of the triune God. The best we can do is open our eyes to the power of God working in our lives. Today's readings help us do that.

In the first reading, the wisdom of God takes our hand and leads us through the marvels of creation. Who has not stood in awe before a sunset, a waterfall, or the smile of an infant? We

are surrounded by the wonders of the natural world—wonders that can fashion us into natural mystics and prompt us to praise our Creator.

Once transformed by his encounter with the risen Christ, Paul proclaims again and again that “we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ” (Romans 5:1). He knows from experience that Jesus is his Savior and the Savior of us all. We may not always realize this, but there are times in the life of each of us when we experience a profound need to be saved.

Finally, in the gospel, it was Jesus himself who promised that the “Spirit of truth” would come and strengthen our faith (John 16:13). Without that Spirit, we might simply wander about in confusion. These readings provide a glimpse into the action of God in our lives. Do we believe what they say? †

The Difficulty of Explaining the Trinity

James L. Papandrea, PhD

It's been said that more heresy is (accidentally) preached on Trinity Sunday than at any other time of the year. This is because...the doctrine of the Trinity is difficult to understand, and it is even more

difficult to explain. When we have to explain the doctrine of the Trinity, we often resort to analogies of "three in one."

This may be the best option we have, though all analogies ultimately fall short because none of them completely captures the balance between oneness (unity) and "threeness" (distinction). They are all either too heavy on the unity, with not enough distinction...or they are too heavy on the distinction, with not enough unity...

***It is this balance
of unity...
and distinction...
that we strive for.***

It is this balance of unity...and distinction...that we strive for in explaining the Trinity with analogies—but which proves to be elusive. The problem is that no analogy from the created world can successfully exemplify both the oneness and the threeness at the same time. A thing is either one thing with three parts, or three things that have some common relationship.... We're trying to use creation to describe the Creator, and since creation is finite, that only gets us so far.

When analogies fail, the only option left may be to describe the Trinity by saying what the Trinity is not. The Trinity is not three gods. The Trinity is also not simply three masks, or hats, worn by the one God when he wants to perform different functions. †
